- I. Call to Order President Block called the Board of Trustee Regular meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

IX. Unfinished Business –

a. <u>Update on Kirkland Public Service Lot –</u> Dale gave an update on the Kirkland Public Service Lot. He is in the process of talking with builders. They are close to getting the ground ready to place the concrete down for the salt building. We will be getting more dirt to finish off the grading of the property.

X. New Business –

- <u>Discussion/Approval of 204 W. North Street Water Main Tap Mr. & Mrs. Smith are the</u> a. new owner of 204 W North Street; they are coming to the Board asking for some help installing the water lines from the b-box to the main. The Village had sent Mr. Butler the old owner a letter some time ago and informed him that his water line came out of the house next to him, and that he did not have a b-box to shut off his water from the outside. If he was to have a problem and need to turn the water off, we would have to go into the house next doors basement and turn it off. Mr. Butler was told at this time that he would need to get his own water line from the house to the main to bring this property up to code. Also, he was told that if he ever wanted to sell this home, he would have to have this done. The Village is willing to waive the tap-on fee of \$2750.00. The Board would like the Smiths to get their quotes and bring them back to the October Board Meeting. President Block asked for a motion for the approval of waiving the \$2750.00 tap on fee. Trustee Fruit made a motion for the approval of \$2750.00 for the property of 204 W North St. with a 2nd made by Trustee Michener. On a roll call vote Trustees Fruit, Ziegler, Michener, Benes, Chambers, and Marshall vote yes. Motion carried.
